Routes into construction

There are many different ways to get into construction whether you want to learn on the job or go to college first - here are some of your options:

Apprenticeships

Earn a wage while you learn, you can start straight from school and you will spend some time in college and some with the employer.

College Courses

Study Vocational courses or A Levels in college full time. You will learn all the theory and technical skills and gain a qualification to help you to get into the industry

T Levels

A relatively new qualification, courses last 2 years and include a minimum of 45 days spent on industry placements, there are around 25 different T level courses available

University

A Full time degree takes 3-4 years to complete, the focus is on academic study, but many construction based degrees include a year out in industry
