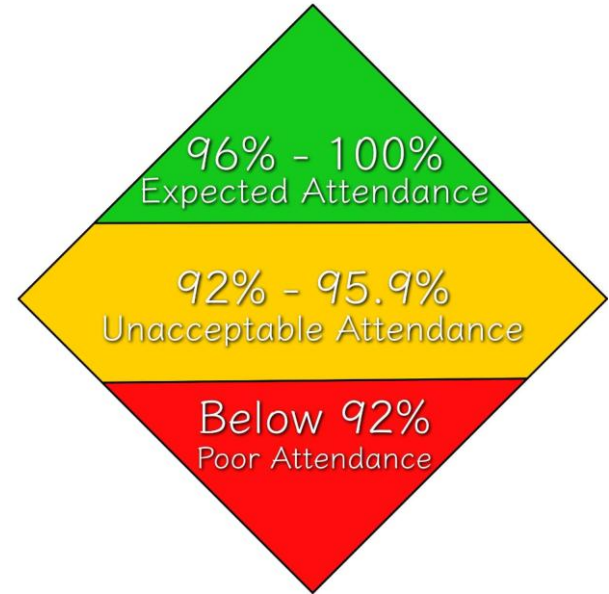

Y10 Work Experience

All students in Year 10 will be expected to undertake five days of work experience next year, as follows:

Cherbourg Campus will start on Monday 7th June - Friday 11th June
Shakespeare Campus will start on Monday 14th June - Friday 18th June

This work experience aims to provide all young people with an opportunity to:

- Obtain a wider awareness of the world of work as part of their general education.
- Learn outside the classroom.
- Increase their economic understanding.
- Get a taste of a potential future career.

Work Experience - How parents can help?

- Can you or a family member provide work experience?
- Look for work experience in the local area
- Encourage your child to come and speak to Mrs Smith if they are struggling to find a placement.
- Check the Employer has Employer Liability Insurance.



Recording Placements

- This year we are using “Unifrog” Placement Tool to log all work experience placements and to communicate with employers.
- It is easy to use and provides a robust way of tracking the process of the placements
- Students will receive a Welcome email from Unifrog with a link to create their account.
- Instructions will be sent out on how to log a placement.

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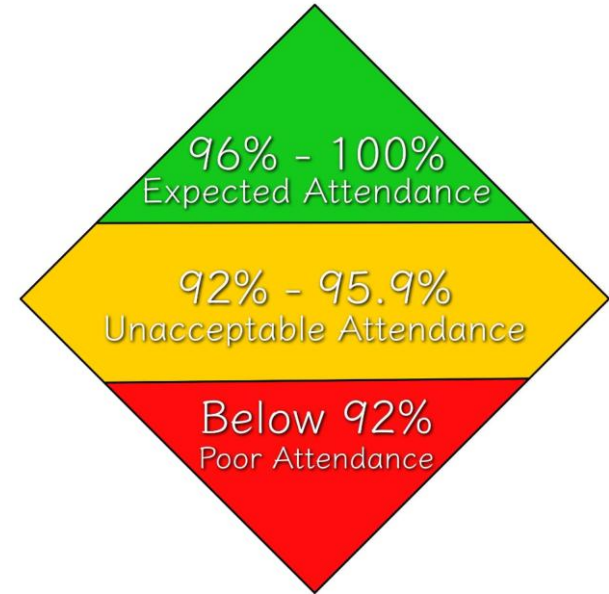
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Expectations of Attendance
